

Formatting dates in the Financial Reporter using the DATESTRING(Date,"sFmt") Function Examples

Date = TODAY(): 01/18/05 1/18/2005

Description	Format Value	DATESTRING Function	Result

Year with century, as decimal number	%Y	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%Y)	2005
Year with century, as decimal number, remove leading zeros	%#Y	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%#Y)	2005
Time-zone name or abbreviation; no characters if time zone is unknown	%z	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%z)	Pacific Standard Time
Time-zone name or abbreviation; no characters if time zone is unknown (Same as %z)	%Z	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%Z)	Pacific Standard Time
Date and time representation appropriate for locale	%#c	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%#c)	Tuesday, January 18, 2005 12:00:00
Date representation for current locale	%#x	=DATESTRING Function(01/18/05,%#x)	Tuesday, January 18, 2005

Note : The Parameters may be strung together to get very descriptive date string.

=DATESTRING(\$C\$2,"%A, the %d day of %B in the year of %Y ")

Tuesday, the 18 day of January in the year of 2005
